Regional Director Report

2024 was a roller coaster year for IPSC Canada. It started off great with our second PCC National Championships in British Columbia. It was a very well run, challenging event and had increased participation from the inaugural one in Halifax in 2023.

As the year progressed, we saw a record number of Level 3 matches being run in Canada and despite the government's handgun ban – we continued to grow.

The PCC Black badge course was being rolled out across the country with hopes of PCC being a new growth route for us.

The Handgun Nationals in Ontario was a bar-setting match. Challenging stages, a well-organized event and capped off with an amazing awards ceremony. We couldn't have asked for more.

The NEC had a few meetings via zoom, ensuring expenditures were kept to a reasonable amount and we accomplished quite a bit.

As we hit the end of the year through – the government decided to throw us a curve ball and banned 324 firearms, which essentially wiped out or whole PCC program. We had to cancel the planned 2025 PCC Nationals in Ontario and our PCC competitors heading to the PCC World Shoot in the Czech Republic are stuck borrowing or renting firearms to compete with and having no firearms to train with.

The NEC finished the year with a good meeting with a conservative member of parliament to express our needs should they come to power in 2025. I'd like to take this opportunity to than all the members of the NEC for their tireless devotion to our sport and all the efforts they put in.

2025 is a massive year, with so very much happening.

The Director of NROI (Jim Smith) and I had a productive meeting with the Conservative shadow ministers for the Attorney General and Public Safety in February. They are assuring us that should they come to power this year, our future will have hope again. They recognize IPSC as the predominant shooting sport in Canada.

The NEC has debated a few topics online and plans an in-person meeting in Toronto in late April.

The Handgun Nationals team in Alberta is working hard and has shown their plans to run an excellent event in late July. As I type this, slots are being distributed to the sections.

There are Four World shoots this year. Action Air, Handgun, PCC and Mini Rifle. I've been working to arrange slots and information for all these events for our members.

IPSC Canada has a great team headed to the PCC World Shoot in the Czech Republic in May with our top 4 ranked competitors:

Taylor Reich, Wesley Stevens, Justin Thomson and Everett Pulido.

Congratulations guys – I am sure you will do us proud! In total, 17 Canadians will attend the PCC World Shoot.

As I type this, we are distributing slots for the Handgun World Shoot in September in South Africa. Over 50 Canadians will be attending this event. The 2002 World Shoot there was an amazing event, so our expectations are high for this year.

Congratulations to all of you!

At the Handgun World Shoot, the General Assembly will meet and elect the IPSC President and make rule changes. We'll be attending and working closely with the assembly for what we believe helps the positive direction of IPSC.

This year there will be a Federal Election. It may come as early as March or as late as October. We've seen that the Liberals and NDP simply hate us. They want to eradicate guns and us along with them. The only vote that is a vote for gun ownership is the Conservatives. Not only have they shown that they are not interested in taking away our sport – they have shown clearly that they believe our sport is important and has a place.

We as gun owners need to do more than just give them votes. We need to help them get the votes. Please take the time to reach out to your local Conservative candidate and volunteer to help and / or send some money to the local candidate. If we don't get a Conservative majority this year, our days will be numbered.

I intend to seek to continue my role as Regional Director in the upcoming RD election. I've had this position since 1997 and been on the NEC as Section Coordinator of Nova Scotia since 1994.

I am uniquely qualified for this position, and I'll go over that now.

I have been a very busy part of the Canadian gun industry for the last 20 years. I personally have imported over 10,000 of the best competition firearms into this country. I know all the players and have connections where they are needed. When handguns were legal to import, I regularly was a major sponsor of our Nationals, having donated multiple guns at events.

I've been a current Range Master in NROI since 2002; having been in that role for at least 20 level 3 matches. I've been the match director for more than 20 level 3s and hundreds of level 2s and I've been the match director for 6 national championships.

I'm a shooter. I took my black badge in 1990. I have twice represented our region on national teams at the World Championships (*Standard – Greece and Classic – Thailand*)) and will again this year in South Africa on the Classic Team. I rarely find myself ranked less than 10th in our national rankings. (*Currently ranked 8th in PCC and 6th in*

Classic Handgun) I received my best finish of second place in Standard at the Nationals in Lethbridge. I have dozens of Nova Scotia provincial titles.

My knowledge and experience with the IPSC General Assembly is deep. There are rules in the rule book that I presented to the assembly and had accepted. I have a great working relationship with the players in IPSC. When I speak at the assembly, I get the respect that Canada deserves. When I talk with the IPSC President; he listens.

I've been invited to join the IPSC Continental Council and the IPSC Constitutional Committee due to my experience and knowledge.

With my leadership comes one of my best friends - Jim Smith, who has been the director of NROI for several years. Jim has worked tirelessly to raise the level of NROI to be the best group of officials in the world. He has assembled a team of hard-working dedicated officials to update training, handle disputes and answer concerns. A National champion and multiple time National Match Director; Jim has worked to ensure that our National events are of the highest caliber.

As Regional Director, it is my primary responsibility to make the sections a cohesive team to promote and grow IPSC in Canada. Points of Views across this country are very diverse and we have some strong-willed people on the NEC, but I can usually find the optimal solution for our region when I work with them. In the RD election, the section coordinator vote. If you like what you here in this article, please let your section coordinator know that you support me.

It's been a privilege and honor to be Canada's Regional Director, and I hope that with the member's support – I can continue that job.

Director of NROI Report

Greetings NROI Canada Officials,

As we reflect on 2024 and look forward to the 2025 shooting season, NROI Canada is proud of the work put in by our officials across the country to support IPSC Canada matches and improve their knowledge and skills through ongoing education.

The training and development of new officials continues across all Sections, with our National numbers now reaching over 890 Range Officers, Chief Range Officers and Range Masters. In 2024 we congratulated 4 new graduates from the National RM program: Colleen Piper (AB), Nick Gan (ON), Antoine Bertrand (QC), and Barry Moore (SK).

Further to our educational goals, NROI Canada began a rollout of the Maintenance Exam in 2023 as a means of refreshing all officials on current rules and providing learning and discussion opportunities. This exam will continue to evolve as rules change but will remain an important part of all officials' ongoing education and certification maintenance. Some of the lessons learned and discussions generated from the exam have made up content in the NROI communications which have recently been sent to all officials. It is our goal to improve communications and resources both through quarterly emails and the future introduction of a revamped NROI Canada website. Your suggestions are helpful in the development of these resources, so please continue to send rule questions, clarification requests and interesting scenarios for inclusion in future newsletters.

Additionally, several members of NROI Canada have contributed to the development of an updated Level 1 seminar. This newly released, revamped seminar is now available for instructors across the country to train their prospective Range Officers and represents the first step in a longer-term project of converting many elements of the seminar to online.

Work is also underway on a new Shotgun Black Badge course for release later this year with the goal of promoting Shotgun participation in advance of the Shotgun World shoot in 2026. The PCC and Handgun Black Badge courses are also undergoing some updates for a 2025 release as well.

Last year's Nationals for Handgun and PCC both featured excellent teams of officials representing every section across Canada. With each passing year we are seeing our National Championships grow in participation, stage development and overall administration.





The Match Directors of the 2025 Handgun Championship have recruited full-time staff, are putting the finishing touches on stages, and promise a stellar match for our country's best to compete for the titles.

Unfortunately, this year's PCC Nationals was wiped out by the Liberal government's last OIC. We are at a critical time for the survival of our sport and as such, strongly encourage every member of the shooting community to contact their local Conservative Electoral District Association and volunteer in any capacity they can. Our existence is in the hands of the Conservative party at this point – we must do everything we can to help.

Many thanks again to all the hard-working officials at every level of match across every section – you continue to represent some of the best officiating in the world.

- Durant l'été on a 1 à 2 match par fin de semaine, si il y en a 2 on s'arrange que ils soient loin un de l'autre. Presque tous les clubs de tirs approuvés IPSC ont leur propre ligue entre 2 et 4 compétitions mais nous avons aussi une ligue qui fait la rotation entre 8 clubs et est très populaire.
- Les champs de tir ici sont petits et étroits, voilà pourquoi nous utilisons autant de mover de toutes sortes et nous sommes habitués de changer de set up des stages en quelques minutes sur le même range.
- Notre niveau III de l'été est le Provincial qui compte depuis quelques années 16 stages et se déroule en groupe de 2 stages au lieu de 4 comme précédemment. Les squads comptent+ environ 14 tireurs ce qui se compare à un groupe de 7 tireurs par stages.
- On a maintenant 2 matchs IPSC SHOTGUN et peut être même 3 cette année car un groupe se prépare pour le Italian Shotgun National niveau III.
- L'an passé un groupe de fervent tireurs IPSC sont descendus à Dalhousie pour aider à monter le 600 balles Summer Slam. Ce n'est peut être pas au Quebec mais c'est tellement simple de monter un match sans nos restrictions Québécoises que ils ont décidés d'y retourner cette année et le match sera niveau III avec des CRO et RO attitrés à leurs ranges respectif.

Hi to all IPSC shooters, Quebec section has around 750 members and let's say with a match almost every weekend but why not go into detail.

- In winter 3 leagues are running, one in Sherbrooke (Lennoxville Club), one in Joliette (Lanaudiere club) and one in Montreal (CTM) all of these with season trophy and compiled results (so easy with Practiscore).

A interior level III match the MIC (Montreal Interior Challenge) is in progress and will be ready for march 28-29-30.

As of today, the 60 cm of snow we received is about to start melting so we can move to the summer season.

- In summer there are 1 or 2 matches per weekend, if they are on the same day we take care that they are far away from each other. Almost all exterior IPSC local clubs have their own league of 2 to 4 matches, we also have a league that moves to clubs around the province with great success.
- Shooting club here are small and narrow this is why we use so many movers of all kinds and set up are made to be turned over in a matter of minutes to make a complete new set of stages.
- Our summer level III match is our Provincial, now at 16 stages held on the Valcartier shooting club and just to let you know stages are run in rotation set of 2 not 4 like previously and squad are big around 14 shooters, it is like shooting in a 7-shooter squad.
- We now have 2 IPSC shotgun matches per year held at the CTRV (Valcartier gun club), may be 3 this year because some need more practicing to be ready for the Italian shotgun National's, who knows?
- Last year a bunch of Quebec IPSC avid shooters went to Dalhousie NB to help build the 600 rounds Summer Slam, ok it is not in Quebec, but it is so easy to set up match there that we return helping again this year and it will be a level III with appointed CRO and RO on each range.

At the World shoot this year, 4 of our shooters are team Canada member

Yves St Laurent (CLASSIC), Olivier Masson Lefevre (STD), Francis Boisvert (OPEN) and Alexandre Berdat (PROD), as usual do your best.

So have fun shooting and don't forget to go help set up at least one match in your region, IPSC need you.







In 2024, IPSC Saskatchewan achieved a series of milestones and experienced many firsts.

We concluded the year with 118 members, the highest membership count in our history.

We hosted our 2024 Provincial Championship Level III match with 132 participants, making it the largest match in our section's history. The match took place at the Saskatoon Wildlife Federation Ranges and was MD'd by Alain Dumuk, who, alongside his crew, did an outstanding job.

Our four dedicated Black Badge instructors trained 38 new shooters, achieving another record as we welcomed them to our sport.

We also celebrated our experienced official, Barry Moore, who officially achieved the rank of Range Master, becoming the first RM in our section. Barry's commitment to the sport is unmatched.

Our exceptionally talented shooter, Wesley Stevens, qualified to represent Canada in both the PCC and Handgun World Shoots, achieving a top 4 ranking in the country—a significant accomplishment.

We continue to host our monthly matches, alternating between Saskatoon and Regina. Last year, we conducted 12 Level matches, including one in Prince Albert. We are collaborating with our members in PA to establish it as a third shooting venue for sanctioned matches in our section.

Financially, we have made significant progress and now maintain a very healthy balance sheet. We have committed to supporting our team members who represent our section at Nationals and will continue to do so. Additionally, we have been allocating funds to both the Saskatoon Rifle and Revolver Club and the Regina Association of Practical Shooters for the purchase of range equipment.

We are doing our utmost to grow our section despite the challenges posed by the federal government, and we remain optimistic as we look forward to a brighter future for our sport.

IPSC Alberta 2024 Year in Review

Our Membership increased in 2024 from 600 to 800 active competitors including 17 youth. PCC (pistol caliber carbine) helped with that increase as well as the willingness of club members to help others to borrow and or lend handguns to new shooters. Even with the political uncertainty over all competitor's heads of what will happen with their firearms. We continue to increase our membership numbers.

IPSC Alberta hosted 31 level two matches plus our Provincial Championship Match through the summer season. Throughout the winter and off season, the clubs across the province continue to host their own level one matches. Some clubs even run level one matches every week.

In 2024 IPSC Alberta had 155 range officials of which 142 were active, certified range officials. In March 2025 there will be 2 Range Officers courses, with a total of 18 candidates enrolled. In April 2025 there will be 1 Chief Range Officers course, with 12 candidates enrolled.

Outlook for the year 2025
